









Seeking the contribution of you and your patients/family caregivers in an online survey on venous leg ulcers



Wounds Australia, New Zealand Wound Care Society, Wound Healing Society of Singapore and Hong Kong Enterostomal Therapists Association are undertaking preliminary work for developing the next edition of the *Pan Pacific Clinical Practice Guideline for the Prevention and Management of Venous Leg Ulcers* (working title). As part of this work, we are conducting a survey of patients, informal carers, health professionals and other stakeholders.

We are seeking your assistance to <u>distribute our invitation</u> to participate in a survey to people who have experienced venous leg ulcers (or who are at risk) and their informal carers. That's not all! We are also interested in your own perspectives as a health professional, or as some who is researching or teaching about VLUs. Your perspective on what is important to include in the guideline will assist the Pan Pacific Venous Leg Ulcer Guideline Committee (VLUGC) in determining guideline content and resources that could accompany the guideline when it is complete.

In Australia, Curtin University Human Research Ethics Committee (HREC) has approved this study (HRE2022-0394). In New Zealand University of Otago has approved this study (H22/083). Risk is considered minimal and all responses are anonymous. The survey will take about 10 -15 minutes to complete on a website.
